WELCOME AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Welcome to worship on this special day.

Our liturgy begins with the liturgy of light and the blessing of the Paschal Candle, which symbolizes Christ's breaking of the darkness of sin and death to bring us all the Easter victory. The Paschal Candle will shine as our symbol of the resurrection throughout the Easter season, at all baptisms and at all funerals. After the blessing, the day is proclaimed with the ancient Easter shout, joyous songs and, festive musical offerings and the word of God that proclaims the victory of Christ for us all. Then the baptized are invited to meet the risen Lord in the bread and the wine of Holy Communion.

Thank you for joining us on this special day. We hope the blessings of the Risen Lord are yours this day and always.

* PASCHAL CANDLE BLESSING

All stand and face the rear of the church.

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Let us pray. O God, you are like a refiner's fire, and your Spirit kindles the hearts of your faithful people. Bless this flame and those who keep this Easter celebration so that, burning with desire for life with you, they may be found fit to take part in that festival of Light which has no ending, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen

The inscription on the Paschal Candle is traced by the Presiding Minister, while saying:

P: Jesus Christ, yesterday and today, the beginning and the ending, Alpha and Omega; all time belongs to him, and all ages; to him be glory and dominion forever and ever.

C: Amen

The Presiding Minister marks the five nails, representing the five wounds of Christ, into the Paschal Candle, while saying:

P: By his holy and glorious wounds, may Christ our Lord guard and keep us.

C: Amen

The Paschal Candle is lighted.

P: May the light of Christ who rises this day in glory scatter the darkness of our hearts and minds. Let us pray. Almighty God, pour out your abundant blessing on this lighted candle, so that all who share in your holy mysteries may be filled with your grace and spiritual blessings. Once we were in darkness, but since we have become the Lord's people, we are in the light. Help us to live as people who belong to the light, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen

As the Paschal is raised, the Presiding Minister proclaims the resurrection, shouting three times:

P: (boldly) Christ is Risen!

C: (boldly) He is risen indeed!

*THANKSGIVING FOR BAPTISM

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

P: Alleluia! Christ is risen.

C: Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!

P: Just as God's work of creation never ends, so the gifts received in baptism are renewed every day. Let us give thanks together for the life given in baptism. We give you thanks, O God, for the waters of life: for water to bathe in, water to drink, for waters to play in and waters that inspire wonder, for water that gives life to our planet.

C: We give you thanks, O God, for the waters of life.

P: We give you thanks, O God, for the waters of this place: for water from our tap, for rain [and snow], for [local water sources may be named].

C: We give you thanks, O God, for the waters of this place.

P: We give you thanks for your salvation through water: for delivering Noah and his family through the floodwaters, for leading your people Israel through the sea into freedom, for preserving your prophet Elijah through the time of drought, for guiding your people across the Jordan into a new land, for quenching the Samaritan woman's thirst with living water.

C: We give you thanks for your salvation through water.

P: We give you thanks for the life of all the baptized, and for all who gather here; for godparents and baptismal sponsors, for children and grandchildren, [for those newly baptized *at the Easter Vigil/in this holy season*;] for our brothers and sisters in Christ whom we have never seen but to whom we are bound.

C: We give you thanks for the life of all the baptized.

P: We give you thanks for life in Christ through your Holy Spirit: for our entry into Jesus' death through these waters, for our new birth into a life of freedom and service, for our calling to be your people, sent out for the life of the world.

C: We give you thanks, blessed and holy Trinity, now and forever. Amen.

*EASTER DIALOG

A: (boldly) Alleluia! Christ is risen!

C: (boldly) He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

A: Worthy is Christ, the Lamb who was slain! Alleluia!

C. He gives us new life and hope through his resurrection! Alleluia!

A: Rejoice then, even in your distress.

C: We shall be counted worthy when Christ appears.

A: God has claimed us as his own.

C: God has called us from our darkness into the light of his day.

A: (boldly) Alleluia! Christ is risen!







C: hear our prayer.

C: Amen.




