FUTURE OF IN-PERSON WORSHIP AT EKLC

As we approach the end of the Safer at Home order in Dane County next week, many questions and concerns still exist. We are keeping the best interest of our membership and communities in mind by continuing to suspend in person services at EKLC.

We all look forward to the time when we can safely gather again for worship, however, it will look very different in the immediate future. Restrictions will be based on recommendations from public health officials. Please remember, we are an older, more vulnerable congregation. Health and safety during this pandemic are our first and foremost concern as a faith community. When the time comes that it is deemed safe by the public health department and Church Council, there will be some changes for our in-person worship. We ask your prayers, patience, and understanding as we implement these health precautions against the COVID-19 virus:

- 1. Physical distancing will be maintained. Some pews will be roped off, you may not be able to sit in your normal spot. Please sit with family household members only.
- 2. Attendees should plan to wear masks.
- 3. Hymnals, bibles, pens etc. will be removed from the pews.
- 4. There will be no singing, passing of the peace or Communion.
- 5. The offering plate will not be passed, it will be located in the narthex.
- 6. No congregating in the Friendship Hall before or after worship, no food.
- 7. Everyone will be required to sanitize their hands before and after worship.
- 8. Everyone is expected to arrive, sit, worship, and then leave immediately following worship.
- 9. We will disinfect the sanctuary, doors, bathrooms, and other spaces we use.

Pastor Brenda will continue online services on Sundays, and Prayers for our people on Tuesday. We are discussing various ideas of how to gather together in the future while remaining safe. We are researching the possibility of having a "drive in" service in June sometime, where members could stay in their cars and tune in to Pastor Brenda preaching outside at church – Stay Tuned!

We will continue to monitor the situation over the coming weeks, and are looking forward to the time when it is safe for groups of 50 to gather. This is more feasible to attempt worship than restricting to 25 or fewer.

We will communicate plans as quickly as we can on all platforms. We ask you to communicate with church friends who do not use the internet or computer – this is the most important things we can do right now! Stay in touch with them and keep them informed so they are not left out!

During this challenging time, let's keep identifying the blessings we have in our lives. Pray for all those combatting this virus, and for the time when we can all be together to worship again soon.
