

TIME FOR CHILDREN

FIRST READING: 1 Samuel 3:1–10 [11–20]

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the LORD under Eli. The word of the LORD was rare in those days; visions were not widespread.

²At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; ³the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the LORD, where the ark of God was. ⁴Then the LORD called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he said, "Here I am!" ⁵and ran to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down. ⁶The LORD called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." ⁷Now Samuel did not yet know the LORD, and the word of the LORD had not yet been revealed to him. ⁸The LORD called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that the LORD was calling the boy. ⁹Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening.'" So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

¹⁰Now the LORD came and stood there, calling as before, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening." ¹¹Then the LORD said to Samuel, "See, I am about to do something in Israel that will make both ears of anyone who hears of it tingle. ¹²On that day I will fulfill against Eli all that I have spoken concerning his house, from beginning to end. ¹³For I have told him that I am about to punish his house forever, for the iniquity that he knew, because his sons were blaspheming God, and he did not restrain them. ¹⁴Therefore I swear to the house of Eli that the iniquity of Eli's house shall not be expiated by sacrifice or offering forever."

¹⁵Samuel lay there until morning; then he opened the doors of the house of the LORD. Samuel was afraid to tell the vision to Eli. ¹⁶But Eli called Samuel and said, "Samuel, my son." He said, "Here I am." ¹⁷Eli said, "What was it that he told you? Do not hide it from me. May God do so to you and more also, if you hide anything from me of all that he told you." ¹⁸So Samuel told him everything and hid nothing from him. Then he said, "It is the

LORD; let him do what seems good to him."

GROWING UP INTO CHRIST

Preparing for our annual meeting on Sunday, 1/25, the Worship Committee approved Interim Pastor Eyster's idea of focusing on the theme, "Growing Up Into Christ" which is based on The Apostle Paul's letter to the Church in Ephesus, "But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love." (Ephesians 4:15-16, NRSV)

The messages on January 11, 18 and 25 will delve into the message of The Apostle Paul in his letters to the Ephesians and Corinthians. While there is identity label, "Ephesians" on the one letter, it is identified as a general letter which Paul wrote to the **WHOLE CHRISTIAN CHURCH** – a circular letter, a universal letter – because of its content. The church in Ephesus is where he served his longest (about 3 years) pastorate and was the strongest and healthiest church among those organized by Paul. The letters to the Corinthians are very specific and direct to that particular congregation including names.

Since the letter to the EPHESIANS is universal to THE WHOLE CHURCH, it has VERY SIGNIFICANT and RELEVANT messages for us – we the people who are the body of Christ at EKLC!

Sunday, 2/1 – 9 am - Service of Worship with Holy Communion. C E L E B R A T I O N !

CELEBRATE the 170th anniversary of the dedication of the first church building of EKLC – the "LOG CABIN CHURCH" – which was held on January 31, 1845.

CELEBRATE EKLC's NORWEGIAN heritage! Everyone invited to wear bunad, Norwegian sweaters, søljer and whatever which is NORWEGIAN. Parts of the Gudstjeneste/Service will be in NORWEGIAN with English translation. THANKS to the research done by BONNIE EHRKE identifying the report of founding pastor J. W. C. Dietrichson about his message at the Dedication of the "Log Cabin" Church on January 31, 1845, Pastor Eyster will use the SAME text (Genesis 35:2-3) and title ("How do we prepare ourselves worthily to go up to Bethel (the house of the God) for the message as we celebrate the 170th anniversary of that event. The liturgy will also include parts from the Ritual of the Church of Norway for Dedication of a Church Building as used on January 31, 1845 as reported by Pastor Dietrichson. Fellowship time with kaffe-coffee and treats, including krumkaker and sandbakkelser.

CELEBRATE EKLC's FUTURE in NEW YEAR 2015 with anticipation of the ministry of a new pastor as the PEOPLE of GOD who are the BODY of CHRIST continue to GROW UP INTO CHRIST building themselves up into Christ!
