## Interns Insight

This Peanuts comic strip debates suffering. Why do we suffer? The idea that suffering is necessary within life, that we have brought it against ourselves because of our actions or the actions of others have brought suffering to us. This idea is one that we wrestle with in life. Linus is right when he says, "The problem of suffering is a very profound one."

The most interesting thing about the comic strip above is that Charlie Brown has a question but everyone has an answer. Often when we are suffering, we may ask questions, we long for an answer but we do not find one. Even when people provide answers, they are ones that either do not make sense in our life or they are ones that we do not want to hear. Yet through suffering, we are reminded that we are in need of God, our creator and sustainer. We are drawn to the story of the cross and the suffering that Jesus went through on our behalf.



The church is a place in which we can escape from the world and our lives and we can find forgiveness and relief from the world. It is the place where the message of Christ and his love for the world is proclaimed and gather together to remind one another of that message of Christ. The message of Christ is one that announces love and caring for one another, of Christ removing suffering from us so that we may enjoy peace and comfort. "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." Matt 11:28 This message is one that is not heard within the world that much. Yet that is one of the main reasons that the message of Christ and the church is so important within the world. This year, I have been blessed to be a part of many people's struggles and suffering, along with joy and helping one another with our faith.

As I am entering into my last month of Internship, I am realizing all of the lessons that I have learned, all the great ministries that I have been involved, but more importantly all the wonderful people that I have been able to meet. The people make up the church. Yes, I have led classes, preached sermons, and plan a number of activities within the church this year but I have learned so much from the congregation members that I am grateful. I have been able to help with families as they say goodbye to a loved one. I have visited people in the hospital when suddenly life took a turn that they were not expecting. I have led classes on various topics. I have helped with confirmation. I have helped with Sunday School. I have served on committees. I have led worship. I have been active within the community. In a sense, I have served as a pastor for this congregation in many capacities. Many of those things listed, I have seen others do. Now I got to be the leader. For all of those lessons and opportunities, I just want to say Thank You. But even those two words do not sum up how grateful I am for this last year.

As I am preparing to go back to an institute that is a theological seminary, I am reminded that it is here in the world and in life that we really interact with God. In life, we see, hear, and receive God's love, grace and comfort from suffering. Along with that, we are all Christ's messengers of God's love and comfort that is found in Jesus Christ. May God grant you peace and blessings.

## *From Pastor Clint : Letters are Prayers*



I happen to think that letter writing is an important form of prayer. When we write a letter, we hold the recipient in mind, attend to what words need to be written, and simply keep that person and situation in mind and before God as we write.

The most sustained letter-writing (snail mail) I've ever engaged in was during my time in Slovakia with a friend from Seattle, WA. He and I carried on a correspondence over a couple of years, averaging one or two letters a week, some lengthy. I have to say that writing back and forth that frequently meant we were conducting a friendship at a level much deeper and profound than many of the friendships I had face-to-face.

Our letters included poems, stories, philosophy, theology, cultural analysis, description. They ranged widely. I still remember one letter especially where he offered a kind of prayer based on a Psalm 46:10:

"Be still and know that I am God.

Be still and know that I AM.

Be still and know that...

Be still and know.

Be still and...

Be still.

Be.

We both made use of this prayer as a kind of mantra, reminding ourselves that we can be still and know that God is. That God is "I Am Who I Am." That we can trust that. That we can simply rest in knowing that. That sometimes you can be still, and the "and" comes along in the stillness. Just be still. Just be.

My friend was more of a mystic, and so was happy to leave it at that. Myself, still irrepressibly Lutheran, I like to remember that I am called to be still, to just be, because that's the best response to know that we are justified for Jesus' sake. God does it, not us.

No matter how you frame it, either theologically in terms of the proclamation of the Gospel, or apophatically, in the presence of God the I AM, it makes a great prayer, and I commend it for regular use.

As an addendum, I should add that my friend is now an Orthodox monk, and I am a Lutheran pastor. I believe that correspondence we conducted over the years helped shape our individual vocations. God can get in the middle of epistolary conversations and do a new thing.


# Give to those in need



## Lamb Mission Bank

God can do great things with our gifts. This craft reminds us that every little coin counts.



When your lamb is full, empty out the coins and give them to a charity or church mission program.

**What you need:**

- Knit glove (black or white)
- 1-foot-long piece of thin ribbon, any color
- Stapler
- Craft glue or hot glue gun
- Fiberfill or cotton balls
- 2 googly eyes

**What you do:**

1. Staple one end of the ribbon to the inside of each side of the glove's opening to make a hanger.
2. For the lamb's body, cover the palm and half of the thumb with glue. Stick the fiberfill or cotton balls onto the glue.
3. Glue a googly eye to each side of the mitten's thumb. (The other fingers will be the legs.)
4. Hang the lamb where you'll see it often. Whenever you have extra change, drop it into your lamb bag.




