Dear Friends in Christ,

Wow, we've had a great start to the new school year! Worship is virtual and in person. Sunday school is too! Confirmation is meeting in the fellowship hall on Wednesday nights. Everything is falling into place.

I still feel the heaviness of "none of this feels like normal." I'm experiencing right alongside you how hard it is to not be church in the way we have done it just seven months ago. I miss seeing people and not having to worry about people's safety. I'm tired of making new decisions because every day is filled with hundreds of them.

We are in this together. We might be apart, but we need each other. We need to remember that being physically distant whether that's in the same building or not is taking care of each other. We need to know that we are the fruit and the branches and Jesus the vine connects us even when we are not in the same space.

The world wants us to think we are separated more than ever right now. If you follow the news on a regular basis (or even a semi-regular basis), October is going to be a rough month. The pandemic continues, our schools and workplaces and homes still feel foreign, and... The election is right around the corner. I want to encourage you to do some reflective Bible study through this time to remind yourself that you belong to God first and foremost, and no matter what happens in our country, we are not separated from one another, and we are not taken away from our Savior, Jesus Christ.

I encourage you to keep your Bibles open this month to Isaiah 40. The whole chapter is so reassuring, and we need this reassurance. I'll give you some highlights from the Common English Bible...

Isaiah 40:1 *Comfort, comfort my people! says your God.*

40:4 *Every valley will be raised up, and every mountain and hill will be flattened. Uneven ground will become level, and rough terrain a valley plain.*

40:10 *Here is the Lord God, coming with strength...*

40:17 *All the nations are like nothing before God. They are viewed as less than nothing and emptiness.*

40:23-24 *God makes dignitaries useless and the earth's judges into nothing. Scarcely are they planted, scarcely sown, scarcely is their shoot rooted in the earth when God breathes on them, and they dry up; the windstorm carries them off like straw.*

40:28 *Don't you know? Haven't you heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the creator of the ends of the earth. He doesn't grow tired or weary. His understanding is beyond human reach...*

40:31 *...but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength; they will fly up on wings like eagles; they will run and not be tired; they will walk and not be weary.*

The hope in this message is that we are God's people, and no matter what we are going through, no matter how difficult our relationships with people or our conflicting worldviews, God is in control. We need not be weary because we all belong to God. That is the best news of all.

Please remember that you are in my prayers often, and I want you to do what feels safe to you during this pandemic. Don't forget about your church - we love you and we need you! Without you, we are not a whole Body of Christ. But take good care of yourself. If we can take care of ourselves through this time, we can take care of others too.

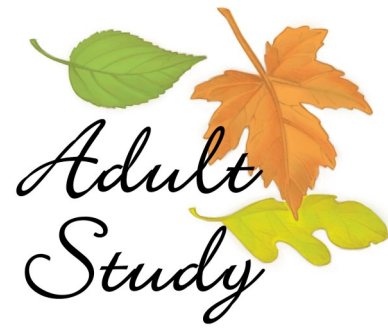
Presidents Message:

EKLC COVID-19 Worship Guidelines

We are excited to begin worshipping in person. As we welcome you back to church, know that personal responsibility is key - any member who is feeling ill or compromised should not attend services. We caution those in the age group (65+) of higher risk to use your best judgment if you should be attending services.

We will continue to live stream services on Facebook and YouTube for those who do not yet feel comfortable attending in person. All members need to be mindful of social distancing, washing hands, and wearing masks to create a safe place to worship.

• Attendees:

- ◇ Enter through Narthex doors only. All others will be locked.
- ◇ Doors will be opened by a greeter or will be propped open.
- ◇ Members must not congregate before or after services.
- ◇ Members are required to wear a mask during worship to help ensure the health and safety of the rest of the congregation.

• Seating:

- ◇ Every other pew will be blocked off to ensure social distance.
- ◇ Ushers will direct members to an area to sit and will usher out by pews at the end of the service.
- ◇ Families may sit together
- ◇ Others must be 6 ft apart from other members.

• Worship:

- ◇ There will be no singing during worship
- ◇ Bulletins will be distributed with all content in them and pew Bibles and hymnals will be removed. **Ushers handing out bulletins will wear gloves.**
- ◇ During Passing of the Peace you will not leave your seat nor shake hands.
- ◇ Offering will be collected in baskets in the Narthex.
- ◇ Communion will only be held during the first service of the month and will be distributed **with gloves** upon entrance to the sanctuary.

• Common Areas:

- ◇ Restrooms directly below the Narthex will be open for use.
- ◇ The following common areas will be closed to members:
- ◇ Friendship Hall
- ◇ Nursery
- ◇ Kitchen
- ◇ Offices (Staff Only)
- ◇ Education Wing

If there is a confirmed positive COVID case from a member that has attended worship, the church will:

- Notify those in attendance of a member testing positive for COVID via phone call
- Send an email to all members notifying them of the positive result
- That information will include:
 - ◇ Date of service
 - ◇ A reminder of next steps (see subsequent bullets)
 - ◇ No other identifying information about the member will be shared
- If you are contacted via phone:
 - ◇ Monitor your symptoms at home, and decide if you should self-quarantine for the 14 day period
 - ◇ If you feel ill, see your primary care provider for a COVID test or use the [public health](#) testing options in your area.
 - ◇ Notify the Property Committee and the church will be sanitized using the cleaning protocol.



HISTORIC GATHERING In an historic assembly, The Rev. Joy Mortensen-Wiebe was elected August 29 to serve a six-year term as the bishop of the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Mortensen-Wiebe was elected on the 3rd ballot with 166 votes. The Rev. Stacie Fidler, pastor of St. John's Lutheran

Church Rock Island, IL received 165 votes. While the Rev. Mortensen-Wiebe is not the first female to be elected bishop of this synod, the election is historic on another level. This is the first time an election for this synod has taken place in which all the gathered were not assembled in person. While normally held at a venue in Madison or the Wisconsin Dells, this year's assembly due to the pandemic was held virtually via videoconference. Credentials reported 347 voting members connected using Zoom and Lumi interactive technologies to elect new leadership of the synod and vote on important matters pertaining to the future of its ministry. The bishop elect currently serves as pastor of St. Luke Lutheran Church in Slinger. She is also a licensed professional counselor and has been working with Professional Service Group, Inc. She formerly served the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin as interim Director for Evangelical Mission, and as an interim pastor of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Mayville and First Lutheran Church in Beaver Dam. From 2004 to 2014, Bishop-Elect Mortensen-Wiebe served as an Associate to the Bishop in the East Central Synod of Wisconsin. She received her Master of Divinity from Luther Seminary, St. Paul, MN in 1992, a Bachelor of Science degree in Religion from Carroll College in Waukesha, WI, in 1988 and a Master of Education Degree from Lakeland College, Sheboygan WI, in 2004. She is married to the Rev. Darin Wiebe and they have two daughters. The Rev. Joy Mortensen-Wiebe's installation is set for October 11, 2020. More information about how this will occur will be forthcoming in future issues of What Matters. Thank you to Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Verona Campus, for providing space for synod staff and nominees, ELCA leadership, parliamentarian, credentials staff, website poster, request-for-voice moderator, Studio Gear audio visual support and help desk volunteers who made this event possible. PEPPER POT SOUP

In a large soup pot fry hamburger (at least 1 lb), onions & celery. Add carrots, beef broth and tomato juice. Season with salt, pepper & chili powder to taste. Cook for at least an hour. Add diced potatoes & cook until tender. Add chopped green peppers, frozen peas & corn (and any other vegetables that need to leave the refrigerator!) Adjust amounts to the amount of soup needed.

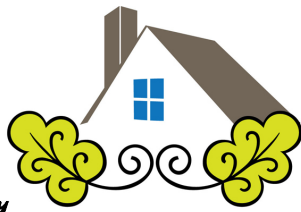

What to expect on Sunday Morning

Please contact the church office if you want to receive a paper copy of our bulletin. Now that we are using the building for worship again, we will stop the weekly bulletin mailings. We will send them to you if you request it. Thank you!

As we gather together for worship in the building since the beginning of March, we want to make sure that you are prepared for what to expect. These are measures that are taken to be as safe as possible during the pandemic.

- Only the front narthex door will be open. The other doors into the building will be locked.
- A greeter will open the door for you.
- Masks are required to wear unless it's not possible in the case of medical necessity, per county public health orders.
- You are not required to take temperatures, but if you would like your temp taken, equipment will be available.
- Hand sanitizer is available at the door.
- Offering plate will be at the front door.
- Ushers will hand out bulletins wearing gloves.
- On Communion Sundays (first Sunday of the month), an usher wearing gloves will hand you a wafer in a ziplock baggie and a salad dressing cup or wine or grape juice.
- An usher will walk you to a pew. The sanctuary will be filled from front to back, so you won't be able to choose the pew you sit in.
- You will sit in your pew for the entire worship service.
- Every other pew will be marked off so you only sit in open pews.
- No singing in worship.
- No shaking hands
- Communion will be taken in the pews with the elements you picked up in the narthex.
- At the end of the service, you'll be ushered out from back to front and leave through the narthex door.
- Bathrooms will be used one family at a time, so please wait spaced out in a line outside of the bathroom door. After using the bathroom, take a Chlorox clean up wipe to wipe down all of the surfaces that you and your family touched.
- There will be no fellowship hour and no coffee.

These all might seem like drastic measures, but we want to be sure to do all we can to be safe and follow guidelines given by the CDC and county public health. Thank you for your cooperation in this.

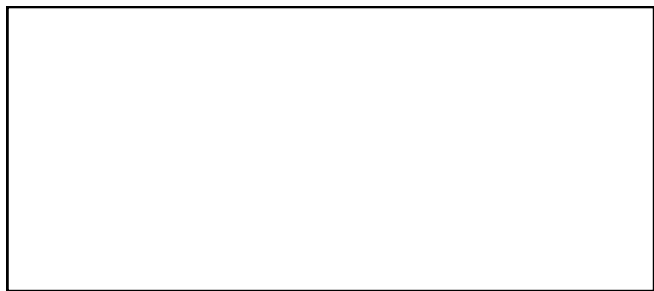
