Dear Friends of EKLC,

I am so grateful for the patience that you have had with our adapted worship and ministry during these COVID pandemic times. These times aren't easy for any of us. We are planning to worship in person soon, and I want to emphasize to you this very thing:

If you don't feel safe coming to worship or education or meetings in the building, please do not worry about coming to church.

This is true for individuals and families in all stages of life. Our most important goal is to give you opportunities to connect with God and your faith community in ways that are safe and healthy. We will always be streaming worship services online, through Facebook and YouTube, so you can join in that way. We are working on ways to make youth and children's Christian education accessible in adaptable ways.

One of the biggest challenges I've had through this pandemic is that I don't know how you are. What do you need to connect with us? We can use Zoom for video studies, and I have access to lots of videos that would give us rich content to discuss. We can do book studies through Zoom. We can just open up the Bible and start discussing it. What is appealing to you? How can we feed your spiritual and social soul?

I am glad to visit you outside of your home during these warmer months. I haul a yard chair around in the back of my vehicle, and I'd be glad to join you for a conversation about anything. Please just let me know if you'd like a visit.

Please also remember the stewardship of generosity. Think of East Koshkonong in your financial giving. Keep me and your

other church leaders - staff, officers, committees - in your prayers. Share a word of encouragement to your fellow church members.

Another challenge I've had is figuring out how to invite children into the congregation by means of baptism. We currently have six babies whose parents want them to be baptized! The congregation is a crucial part of a baptism service as we make promises to the child and the family about how we will support them in their covenant with God. But many pastors, including me, are figuring out ways to do baptisms privately. You might see a livestream of a baptism on our Facebook page or our YouTube channel in the coming months. Please support these families with encouragement and care.

This fall, we will begin the last year of the Narrative Lectionary. It's a four-year cycle, and this year will complete our 4 years through it. We started in the John year in 2017-18, Matthew year in 2018-19, Mark year in 2019-20, and now we come upon the Luke year for 2020-21. The first half of the year, up to Christmas, walks us through the Old Testament, which will give us some foundational texts when we get to Luke between Christmas and Easter. After Easter, we will be in Acts and Galatians, up until Pentecost.

In September and October, we will be looking at the promises God made to God's people and how the people broke these promises over and over again. It's sure to be an interesting section of the year!

Changes to agenda: Added discussion of removal of trees that are dying, located near cemetery.

Opened devotions and a prayer by Pastor Brenda.

Financial updates, Memorials, Profit Loss statement, Money Market account reports were presented by Judy Lund. Robert Furseth memorial specifically designated for Children's Choir. Low activity on Money Market. Health Ministry 250 masks expense, to come out of General fund. Total income above last year at this time and is up considerably. The reason for increased income is likely due to Vanco and donations. Also noted that most users using Vanco have reoccurring payments set up.

Motion to approve financial reports made by Kristen, seconded by Tom, approved and passed.

Minutes from May meeting submitted by Jason Schlieckau reviewed and a motion made by Kristen and seconded by Tom, passed.

The following submitted reports were reviewed: Education Committee, Worship and Pastor's report. Motion to approve reports made by Kristen and seconded by Jason.

Old Business

Discussion on "Prayground" idea submitted by Education Committee. Plans were reviewed by all Council members and there were no questions or concerns. Funds to come from Undesignated Memorials. A motion made by Kristen to approve the project to proceed and seconded by Jason, accepted and passed.

COVID discussion and planning for going forward.

6/28/20 drive-in theme. Let people sit outside vehicle-tailgate/lawn chairs (includes communion)

7/5/20 online only

7/12/20 inside/outside simulcast (includes communion)

Discussed sending out survey, testing feelings about coming back to church.

New Business

Outdoor service feedback discussed. Feedback was mostly positive. Couple things to work on for next time: Wind and delay in audio. It's suggested to turn radio off for singing. While preparing for next service, Tom, Pastor and Jason will do a complete setup for all equipment the day before for testing.

New contract for Mark Veley for ground maintenance discussed. Motion to approve increase in contract made by Kristen, seconded by Tom, approved and passed.

Future weddings at upper church discussed. Official capacity of upper church will be determined and this will determine how many guests can attend the wedding. Council can only make suggestions, but ultimately it's up to the wedding group/guests to decide, since they are leasing the space, pastor is not officiating. Use approved without a vote by Council. Pastor visits going forward, discussed. Pastor to ask if people want visits.

EKLC COVID-19 Worship Guidelines

We are excited to begin worshipping in person. As we welcome you back to church, know that personal responsibility is key - any member who is feeling ill or compromised should not attend services. We caution those in the age group (65+) of higher risk to use your best judgement if you should be attending services.

We will continue to live stream services on Facebook and YouTube for those who do not yet feel comfortable attending in person. All members need to be mindful of social distancing, washing hands, and wearing masks to create a safe place to worship.

- **Attendees: Phase 2: 50% occupancy – 110 persons (Phase 3: 75% occupancy - 170))**
 - ◇ Enter through Narthex doors only. All others will be locked.
 - ◇ Doors will be opened by a greeter or will be propped open.
 - ◇ Members must not congregate before or after services.
 - ◇ We strongly recommend that members wear a mask during worship to help ensure the health and safety of the rest of the congregation.
- **Seating:**
 - ◇ Every other pew will be blocked off to ensure social distance.
 - ◇ Ushers will direct members to an area to sit and will usher out by pews at the end of the service.
 - ◇ Families may sit together
 - ◇ Others must be 6 ft apart from other members.
- **Worship:**
 - ◇ There will be no singing during worship in Phase 2 (Phase 3 is TBD).
 - ◇ Bulletins will be distributed with all content in them and pew bibles and hymnals will be removed.
 - ◇ During Passing of the Peace you will not leave your seat nor shake hands.
 - ◇ Offering will be collected in baskets in the Narthex.
 - ◇ Communion will only be held during the first service of the month and will be distributed upon entrance to the sanctuary.
- **Common Areas:**
 - ◇ Restrooms directly below the Narthex will be open for use.
 - ◇ The following common areas will be closed to members:
 - ◇ Friendship Hall
 - ◇ Nursery
 - ◇ Kitchen
 - ◇ Offices (Staff Only)
 - ◇ Education Wing

If there is a confirmed positive COVID case from a member that has attended worship, the church will:

- Notify those in attendance of a member testing positive for COVID via phone call
- Send an email to all members notifying them of the positive result
- That information will include:
 - ◇ Date of service
 - ◇ A reminder of next steps (see subsequent bullets)
 - ◇ No other identifying information about the member will be shared
- If you are contacted via phone:
 - ◇ Monitor your symptoms at home, and decide if you should self-quarantine for the 14 day period
 - ◇ If you feel ill, see your primary care provider for a COVID test or use the [public health](#) testing options in your area.
 - ◇ Notify the Property Committee and the church will be sanitized using the cleaning protocol.

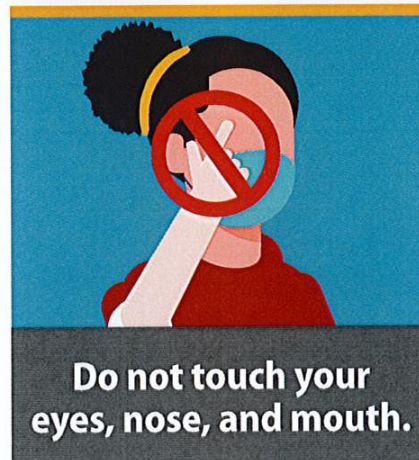
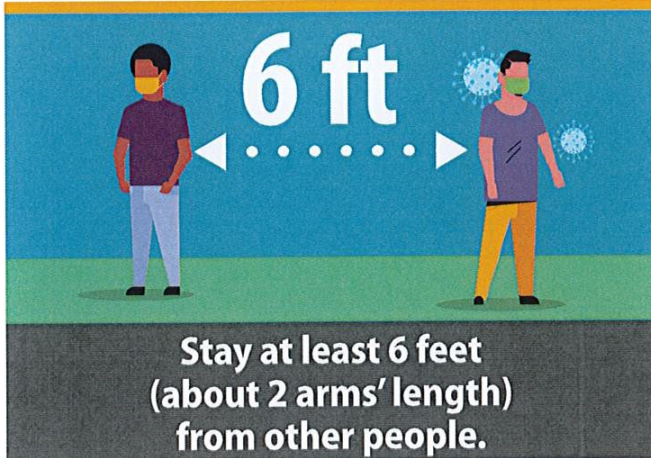


Church Mutual Consultation

TOMATO SALSA

- 1 1/2 cups chopped onion
 - 3 cloves garlic, chopped or powder
 - 1 cup bell peppers, chopped
 - 5 Jalapeno peppers, chopped
 - 25-30 tomatoes, chopped
 - 3/4 cup sugar
 - 1 1/2 cups apple cider vinegar
 - 2 TBSP salt
 - 2 (12 ounce) cans tomato paste
- Combine all ingredients except for tomato paste, simmer for 1 hour. Add tomato paste and cook another 30 minutes. Put in pint jars and seal. Bake in 250 degree oven for 1 hour. Remove from oven and let cool and seal. Makes 8 pints.

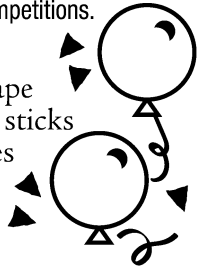

What to expect on Sunday Morning

Please contact the church office if you want to receive a paper copy of our bulletin. Now that we are using the building for worship again, we will stop the weekly bulletin mailings. We will send them to you if you request it. Thank you!

As we gather together for worship in the building since the beginning of March, we want to make sure that you are prepared for what to expect. These are measures that are taken to be as safe as possible during the pandemic.

- Only the front narthex door will be open. The other doors into the building will be locked.
- A greeter will open the door for you.
- Masks are required to wear unless it's not possible in the case of medical necessity, per county public health orders.
- You are not required to take temperatures, but if you would like your temp taken, equipment will be available.
- Hand sanitizer is available at the door.
- Offering plate will be at the front door.
- Ushers will hand sanitize often and hand a bulletin to you.
- On Communion Sundays (first Sunday of the month), an usher will hand you a wafer in a ziplock baggie and a salad dressing cup or wine or grape juice.
- An usher will walk you to a pew. The sanctuary will be filled from front to back, so you won't be able to choose the pew you sit in.
- You will sit in your pew for the entire worship service.
- Every other pew will be marked off so you only sit in open pews.
- No singing in worship.
- No shaking hands
- Communion will be taken in the pews with the elements you picked up in the narthex.
- At the end of the service, you'll be ushered out from back to front and leave through the narthex door.
- Bathrooms will be used one family at a time, so please wait spaced out in a line outside of the bathroom door. After using the bathroom, take a Chlorox clean up wipe to wipe down all of the surfaces that you and your family touched.
- There will be no fellowship hour and no coffee.

These all might seem like drastic measures, but we want to be sure to do all we can to be safe and follow guidelines given by the CDC and county public health. Thank you for your cooperation in this.

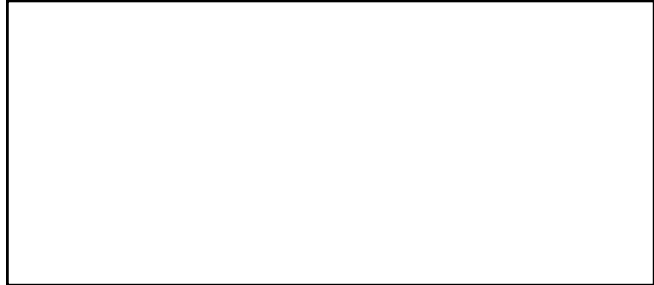
