WHAT IS WORSHIP?

Worship stands at the center of our faith. Through God's word, water, bread and prayer we are nurtured in faith and sent out into the world.

The Pandemic has certainly changed our worship experience since March of 2020. Safe protocols are in place but that does not diminish the enriching and fulfilling worship being offered.

We hear the gathering, meditation and sending hymns. We confess, receive absolution. There are readings from the Old and New Testament and a sermon based on a text. Prayer intercessions lift up all people. We recite our beliefs through The Creed, pray The Lord's Prayer and receive a Blessing as we are sent out.

The Worship Committee encourages you to join us virtually or in person each Sunday as we are part of the Community of Believers.

EKLC COVID-19 Worship Guidelines

We are excited to begin worshipping in person. As we welcome you back to church, know that personal responsibility is key - any member who is feeling ill or compromised should not attend services. We caution those in the age group (65+) or of higher risk to use your best judgement if you should be attending services.

We will continue to live stream services on Facebook and YouTube for those who do not yet feel comfortable attending in person. All members need to be mindful of social distancing, washing hands, and wearing masks to create a safe place to worship.

•Attendees:

- ◊Enter through Narthex doors only. All others will be locked.
- ◊Doors will be opened by a greeter or will be propped open.
- ◊Members must not congregate before or after services.
- ◊Masks will be required during worship to help ensure the health and safety of the rest of the congregation.
- ◊Please exercise 6' of social distancing whenever possible.
- ◊An usher will be taking attendance of anyone who joins in person for service.

•Seating:

- ◊Every other pew will be blocked off to ensure social distance.
- ◊Ushers will direct members to an area to sit and will usher out by pews at the end of the service.
- ◊Families may sit together
- ◊Others must be 6 ft apart from other members.

•Worship:

- ◊There will be no singing during worship
- ◊Bulletins will be distributed with all content in them and pew bibles and hymnals will be removed.
- ◊During Passing of the Peace you will not leave your seat nor shake hands.
- ◊Offering will be collected in baskets in the Narthex.
- ◊Communion will be held weekly and will be distributed upon entrance to the sanctuary.

•Common Areas

- ◊Restrooms directly below the Narthex will be open for use.
- ◊Fellowship Hall is open but social distancing and the seating guidelines above will be required.
- ◊The following common areas will be closed to members:
 - ◊Nursery will remain closed.
 - ◊Kitchen will remain closed.
 - ◊Offices will be open for staff only.

If there is a confirmed positive COVID case from a member that has attended worship, the church will:

- Once the office is notified of the positive case, the council president will be notified. Upon notification, the following will go into effect:
 - Notify those in attendance of a member testing positive for COVID via email (or phone call if no email is listed in the directory)
 - That information will include:
 - ◊Date of service
 - ◊A reminder of next steps (see subsequent bullets)
 - ◊No other identifying information about the member will be shared
 - If you are contacted:
 - ◊Monitor your symptoms at home and decide if you should self-quarantine.
 - ◊If you feel ill or develop symptoms, you should be tested.
- Notify the Property Committee and the church will be sanitized using the cleaning protocol.

Sanitization Procedures (Both churches if used)

- Follow CDC guidelines
- High Touch Areas to be cleaned following services:
 - ◊Doorknobs/Handles, light switches
 - ◊Specific for Sanctuary & Narthex:
 - *Pews
 - *Furniture
 - *Elevator and elevator buttons
 - *Podium
- Restrooms:
 - ◊Doorknobs/Handles, light switches, countertops, faucets and toilets will be cleaned in the restrooms below the Sanctuary after every service.
- Office areas: (during the week)
 - ◊Doorknobs/Handles, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, sinks, etc.
 - *Office staff to take care of personal areas
- In the event of a positive case is confirmed following a service:
 - ◊Wait 24 hours to enter building and disinfect
 - ◊Those cleaning must wear protective wear, ie: gloves etc.

March 23rd, 2021 EKLC Council Meeting Minutes

Meeting was called to order at 6:19 pm. Those in attendance were Kristen Lien, Jaime Lewellin, Tom Locchetta, Oren Hammes, Kim Timler, Nathan Stach and Jason Schlieckau.

Additions to agenda: Property Committee discussion

Devotions- Kristen

Discussed Judy's role, and reports, for new member's information.

Financial updates, Profit Loss statement, Money Market account, Memorials discussed. PPP loan applied for and received. Discussed the criteria needed to make the loan forgivable versus one that would have to be paid back. If loan is forgiven it will need to move to Profit/Loss statement.

A motion made by Jamie to approve financial reports, with second by Oren, accepted and passed.

Minutes from February meeting submitted by Jason Schlieckau were reviewed. A motion by Tom, seconded by Jason, passed.

Other reports reviewed- Stewardship, Worship and Education Committee.

Playground available for Palm Sunday, so it needs to be cleaned/sanitized.

Mention playground in upcoming newsletter.

Lutherdale camp discussion. Two night stay -parents asked not to attend.

Funds avail from Money Market account and family to also pay small amount.

Look into allowing Vanco to make payment too.

Prop committee discussion: Sanitizing church after service and walk through by others for additional sets of eyes.

A motion made by Jason to approve reports and seconded by Jamie, accepted and passed.

Old Business

COVID-19 Discussion

Sunday School update: Sunday School and Confirmation to continue and finish year virtually. Discussions have been productive virtually.

First in-person service procedure discussion. Eleven pews available.

Ushers to escort overflow to balcony and downstairs if count is over fifty.

Supply Pastor Status: Lots of churches are looking for pastors currently.

Marie is new synod liaison for finding a supply pastor. Pastor Berggren will continue through March and into April.

Call committee update: Our church profile is being created/written. This committee meets every 2 weeks.

Next steps

Create Call Process Budget -\$2500 Budget.

Jaime made motion to approve the \$2500 budget for the tasks of call committee with any overages to be approved by the Council president. Oren seconded this motion.

Installation of Call Committee. Will ask the Call Committee after Easter week when they want to be installed.

Council had a brief discussion relating to future pastor's compensation package.

Pastor's office remodel discussed. Motion made to approve budget, not to exceed \$5000 without council approval, made by Tom and seconded by Jamie

New Business

Review of accounts and signers at Hometown Bank. Discussed removal of members that are no longer valid signers.

Review of Constitution with updates using new model. This will be discussed over several future meetings. This will need a congregation vote for approval. Plan for vote at next congregation meeting.

Ron to sit in on next meeting and discuss the two different funds that the Violet Jasensky donation will be placed into.

Council Installation: Date set for 4/25/21 pending discussion with Pastor Dave.

Fire-pit topic addressed: Current location is not working out. Education Committee would like to see moved to grassy area between churches or other spot in back of cemetery. Checking with Lane for location.

Next meeting 4/20/21 at 6:15 PM.

Motion made by Jason and seconded by Jaime to adjourn at 8:34 PM.

- Our first in-person services were a great success. Thanks to the worship committee, altar guild, property committee, assistant ministers, supply pastor, money counters, musicians, ushers, video recorders, council members, and anyone else that I've missed. It takes a village.
- Property committee, cemetery board and Aagot Borge committee worked together to get several dead trees taken down. Thanks to Lane, Johnny, and Curt for getting that done.
- Thanks to the call committee for their speedy work on our congregational profile. It is not an easy task to make all of our gifts eloquent in prose.
- Council installation was 4.25. Thank you to our new members, Nathan, Oren, and Kimberly. We've already had the benefit of your wisdom and work.
- We are still walking and on our way to Munich from Strasbourg Germany. Join us on the Walk to Bethlehem, details later in the newsletter.

Looking ahead:

- We will continue to have both an option to worship in-person and virtually.
- I continue to be in contact with the synod on interim pastor availability. No news yet.
- We are removing the 50 person limit on worship and replacing it with an expectation of social distance. Depending on the size of family groups we feel like we can comfortably fit between 50-75 people in the sanctuary. Please continue to

maintain your distance. We aren't through this yet!

- Several youth will attend Lutherdale camp this summer. Thanks to the education committee for organizing and the Christensen Memorial Scholarship that is helping to fund.

May Congregational Challenge

I've been thinking a lot about systems lately. And how the pandemic broke many systems that we use. Also, people who were integral parts of existing systems have used this an opportunity to back away from some work they did before.

Your May challenge is to think about the systems at church that you just expect to exist. The reality is that all of those systems require people to run them. Ushers and greeters, don't just appear. Readers and money counters don't just decide to show up. 

Make a sunflower, which turns its head to follow the sun.

- Paper plate
- Yellow marker
- Scissors
- Yarn (black and brown)



What you do:

1. Color the entire plate yellow.
2. Around the edge, cut out an odd number of triangles. Evenly space the cuts to form flower petals.
3. Poke a hole in the plate's center. String black yarn through the hole and over one triangle cut. Tie a knot at the back of the plate.
4. Continue looping yarn through the hole and over the remaining cuts. Secure the end. The flower should look like a wagon wheel with black spokes.
5. Tie the brown yarn to a black "spoke." Weave the brown yarn over and under the spokes in a circle. Continue until the sunflower has a large center. Then tie the end.

Let's Walk to Bethlehem! ...We're still walking!

At EKLC our mission statement includes Gathering. During this time of COVID it is hard to be together as a congregation. Gather by joining the EKLC World Walking Group on a virtual Walk to Bethlehem.

Each individual who joins the group will record their real world steps walking, miles biking, meters rowing, etc. All of these steps, pedals, and strokes will be used to virtually traverse the 7400 miles from here to Bethlehem.

Let's keep healthy this winter and do something together even when we are apart!

You do not have to have a computer to participate. Follow the appropriate steps below to join us.

How to Participate:

High Techy Folks



1. Search and download **World Walking** from your app store (either iphone or android).
2. Search for the EKLC Group.
3. Create an account and connect to the group.
4. Add the Walk to Bethlehem walk to your account by clicking on the walk from within the group and saying **Join Now**.
5. Connect your account to your fitness device. If you are doing this from your phone, you will get a prompt..
6. **Move!** Your steps will sync to the app. You will need to move your banked steps to the walk in order for them to count toward our destination.
 - a. If you bike or row you may need to manually add those miles as your fitness tracker may not count them.

Low Techy Folks

1. Go to <https://worldwalking.org/> .
2. Click on Groups.
3. **Search** for EKLC in the search field and select the group by clicking on it.
4. **Join this group** by clicking on the button of the same name.
 - a. You will need to Register with your name and email.
5. Once in the group add the Walk to Bethlehem by selecting the EKLC group in your Dashboard, clicking on the Walk to Bethlehem, and choosing **Join Now**.
6. **Move!** This can be walking, biking, or marching in place while watching TV.
7. Track your steps or miles in the app. From your Dashboard use **Add Steps** to log the miles/ you've moved. (note that you can log in either mode steps or miles....or kilometers if you want to be Canadian)
8. Choose **Spend Steps** to apply those steps to our walk. You can do this each time you log or at some other interval. Note, your steps will not be logged to our walk until you "Spend" them.

No Techy Folks

1. **Move!** This can be walking, biking, or marching in place while watching TV.
2. Track your steps or miles on a piece of paper.
3. Call the church office once a week with your weekly counts. Julie will enter them manually in our walk. You can leave a message if the office is closed.
 - a. Alternatively, you could get a family member to create an account for you (see Low Techy Folks) and track your individual progress toward our group goal.



