NEWS FROM THE CALL COMMITTEE

The EKLC profile has been available for candidates to view. Now we wait for the Synod to send candidates for interviewing.

EKLC Council Meeting Minutes

July 20th, 2021

Meeting was called to order at 6:16 pm. Those in attendance were Kristen Lien, Jaime Lewellin, Tom Locchetta, Oren Hammes, Kim Timler, Nathan Stach, Linda and Loren Schumacher and Jason Schlieckau.

Devotions- Jaime 100 Days to be Brave —Be Generous with Your Time - Romans 12 - 13

Financial updates, Profit Loss statement, Money Market account, Memorials.

Profit/Loss income down 17,000 compared to this time last year, and down 35,000 from 2019, but still positive 25,000. We are currently bringing in less, but we are also spending less. This could be a concern once we start paying a full time pastor. This should be considered throughout the Call process. This also does not include the PPE loan of approximately 25,000. Compare again in the fall and gauge how we are doing at that time. Vanco offerings are up about 9,000 from last year and this is more consistent income. Fuel costs could increase be 1/3 again this year. Discussion on increasing this budget line item.

Motion to approve financial reports made by Jaime, seconded by Oren, passed.

Review of Minutes from June meeting.

Motion to approve Minutes made by Tom, seconded by Kim, passed.

Education Committee Minutes discussion:

Debbie, Erica and Denise have been meeting to discuss a Sunday school plan. They plan on running the Sunday school program with Erica and Denise and think they can get by without a youth choir director. In place of this director, material from You Tube and MP₃ players and Sparks program will be used. A preenrollment survey indicates that attendance will be around 15 children. With this small size, it's likely that virtual Sunday will not be offered. They will probably need help with the Christmas Program. Practices will be Dec 5th and 12th with the program set for the 19^{th.} Children will still sing the first Sunday of the month. Might be worth considering getting a person to manage things like running equipment, and keeping kids focused.

Personnel Committee Discussion:

Exit interview for Debbie to be conducted by Jamie and Chris, scheduled for the August 2^{nd} . Laptop will be collected.

Property Committee Minutes discussion:

Tuck point budget discussed. Tuck Pointing is done and discussed using these funds for replacement three fans in sanctuary. Tom to get bids on fan replacements.

Prayground Sign mounting discussion.

Fire pit discussion. Contacted two Boy Scout troops to build the fire pit and both said no. The decision to construct it ourselves was made.

Two funerals upcoming on the 21^{st.} Pastors not involved with either. Funeral donations discussed. Tom to open church this day and clean between.

A motion made by Tom to approve reports and seconded by Jason, accepted and passed.

Old Business

In person worship concerns:

There's been concerns raised by members, wanting singing back and social distancing gone. Surveying other area churches indicates that social distancing is still happening and singing is still limited. EKLC's views and COVID practices are still aligned with other area churches. We will be removing half the tape from the pews. This will give people more of a choice to social distance or not. Coffee hour will still not be happening. Kristen to talk to congregation this Sunday and warn about the possibility of going back to masks, the Delta variant, and also take a show of hands on a preferred path to proceed, related to masks and singing. Kids continue to be the main concern, as they can't get a vaccine. Communion is to continue as is.

Live stream camera update. New camera being tested that allows for a simple operation.

Interim Pastors Report:

Interim pastor duties discussion. Main job is to be pastors, but also sheppard us through the transition into a full time pastor by fine-tuning the MSP and working with the Call committee. Youth Director conversation. Call committee insistent about getting a Youth Director in place prior to a full time pastor. We don't know how long it will be for a full time pastor, so it probably does make sense to start looking for a Youth Director now. After Debbie's exit interview, the Personnel committee will review the job description and then give their recommendation to the council at the next council meeting how to proceed with the position. Youth gathering next year. Jennifer at Grace could help out but also we would need parent to chaperone for assistance. If need be, Brenda also offered to help. Julie will send email to people in age group that fit the category of going on this trip. Fundraising discussion - we have funds available here to offset some of each individual's cost.

Survey to be constructed for the congregational input sections of the MSP. This survey gives the congregation a chance to pick qualities in a pastor that are important to them. This will be mailed and/or emailed to the congregation, and will have a deadline to return.

Discussion of parsonage and how it relates to the MSP. This has also been discussed in the recent Call Committee meeting. Property cleanup. Mulch outside - Jacob Robinson and Home to Shore Landscaping donated mulch. Tom to send thank you. Have Julie mention this on Facebook and include a comment in the bulletin.

Phone service update. Frontier stated they fixed the problem the next day. I got a call saying the issues were resolved. Jason to contact Julie and confirm. Jason to also get some pricing info on phone service alternatives, to lower the costs associated with the monthly phone bill.

New Business

Sons of Norway visit on 8/15. Ok to use fellowship hall. Kristen to inform Bonnie, as she will be coordinating the visit.

Community café to happen and EKLC is in charge of the September dinner. We agreed that we should continue the dinner this year. Kristen to ask Brenda Schroeder if she is willing to coordinate it again.

Newsletter updates. Take out new Youth Choir Director item. Acolyte and Confirmation schedule contact person missing. Change Julie to be the new contact. Have kids sign up for acolyte schedule at first Confirmation meeting. Update pews being taped off item.

Confirm next meeting: August 17, 6:15 PM (Devotions – Oren) Adjourn at 7:56PM - Motion made by Tom, seconded by Jaime. Close with Lord's Prayer Submitted by Jason Schlieckau

The ELCA Youth Gathering is just a year away! Want to go and have an inspiring experience?

What is it? The Gathering is a 4day inspiring faith formation event where 35,000 Lutheran high schoolers from all over the country come together to learn, interact, worship, have fun, and serve together.

Where is it? This time, the Gathering will be held in Minneapolis. Our Synod will transport us to Minneapolis and within Minneapolis/St. Paul by charter bus.

Who can go? Youth who are currently going into 8th – 12th grades.

Cost: About \$1200 per person. That sounds like A LOT, I know. But we hope to fundraise most, if not all that cost. We're asking each youth to contribute \$100 as a deposit.

Some Specifics: We'll be gone from Saturday, July 23- Thursday, July 28.

We'll be housed in Twin Cities area hotels with churches from our synod.

Each day will be a different focus. There will be a Service Learning Day, an Interactive Learning Day, and a Synod Day. Each evening will be a Mass Gathering at the US Bank Stadium, where we'll learn, worship, and hear incredible speakers and musicians from all over the world. Introductory Information

Dates:

Saturday, July 23 (bus to Minneapolis) – Thursday, July 28, 2022. Gathering begins the evening of July 24.

What will we be doing?

Meeting and getting to know youth from our church, our synod, and all over the country.

Service Learning Day – a day of doing a service project or learning about important issues in the Minneapolis area.

Synod Day – Gathering with all the youth in our synod for conversations, activities, music, and worship together.

Interactive Learning Day – A day spent in a conference center with dozens of exhibits, games, activities, and meaningful opportunities like donating blood and donating hair, putting together personal care kits, helping to build a Habitat house, etc.

Mass Gatherings – Each day will end with speakers and worship with 35,000 people in a sports arena. One of the most meaningful experiences of the Gathering.

Transportation and Housing:

We will travel to Minneapolis by charter bus, which will also be our bus within Minneapolis during the week. We'll be going with other congregations in our area. We'll also do a lot of walking.

Our group will be housed in a hotel in the Twin Cities with the other churches in our synod. (We'll find out where in January) Youth will be assigned rooms and will likely have 3-4 kids in each room.

Food:

For breakfast, we'll likely buy food so we can eat in our hotel rooms each morning. Some of our meals will be provided by the Gathering. For other meals, we'll find restaurants and/or eat from food trucks in the area.

Adult Leaders:

Pastor Jennifer Jelinek and Pastor Brenda Lovick will be leading our group. Depending on our numbers, we may need an additional leader.

Expectations:

All youth will attend monthly meetings to help prepare for the gathering. Youth who want help paying for the trip will participate in fundraising.

All youth will sign a behavioral covenant for the Gathering, which includes respecting leaders, youth, staff, and the facilities at the Gathering, caring for one another, refraining from sexual activity and use of tobacco, alcohol, or drugs. Violation of this covenant will result in the youth being sent home at their own expense.

Cost:

About \$1200 per person, which includes the Gathering, hotel, transportation, food, and Gathering Tshirt. We're asking each student to pay \$100 to secure their spot. Families may pay the whole amount, but we'll do major fundraising to try and earn the rest.






ADULT EDUCATION COORDINATOR
