This is the time of year when people go around telling each other "happy new year". I think people enjoy the sentiment of the "new year" because it's a way of offering fresh start, it's a chance to create something "new". To celebrate and live into this "new year" people often make resolutions. Regardless of whether or not people are able to follow these resolutions, the intension behind them is always to improve people's lives and to improve the world through doing something "new".

The Bible also describes how God is doing something "new". Specifically, the book of Revelation proclaims that there will be "a new heaven and a new earth" (21:1). Where God will dwell amongst humans, eliminating the power of pain and death (21:3-4). Doesn't that sound like good news? It's certainly much

How different do you think this world might look if we started trusting in this vision and working towards it so "all things" could be made "new"? In 2024, I'd like to propose that as a resolution for everyone, as God continues working to "make all things new".





Members of the Sons of Norway (District 5) joined the East Koshkonong Lutheran Church in worship on October 29, 2023. They were taking part in the Annual Destination Stoughton Weekend including tours and events connected to Norwegian heritage and culture. After worship they visited the history displays at the lower building, enjoyed delicious treats and coffee, and then walked the cemetery road for a tour of the upper church building.

On the walk through the cemetery, they stopped to recognize the site of the 1844 Log Church. This stone is from the farm fields of EKLC member Franklin Lien and with the help of Dan Hensel, Tom Hensel, and Lane Taylor was placed in the cemetery this summer in the approximate area of the first building of worship for the pioneer families in the East Parish. This stone is a reminder of their ancestor's commitment to establishing a strong church community founded on faith and trust in God.

This is the first tour group to view the stone/marker to show the location of the 1844 log church; 4 rows to the north of the driveway. The log church measured 36 feet long x 28 feet wide. White metal fence posts mark the dimensions. Previous cemetery board members have told the story of being able to see the outline of the building in dry seasons each year. There is a cemetery map indicating the location of the early church steps.

Before 1844, the pioneer families met in their individual homes for worship and singing of hymns. J.W.C. Dietrichson was the Pastor in 1844 through 1850. Because of the many immigrants over a widespread area, the Koshkonong settlement was divided into two parishes; the East and West parishes.

October 10, 1844, Pastor Dietrichson held a worship service on the Amund Anderson farm. About 40 families adopted a constitution establishing East Koshkonong, the First Norwegian Lutheran Church in America. The western parish was organized October 13, 1844; there is a marker at that site also. Both EAST and WEST parishes began work building an identical log church at that time. They had movable benches that served for seats; a plain table, adorned with a white cloth and a black wooden cross for the altar. In 1858 the Log Church at East Koshkonong was replaced with a larger Stone Church to accommodate the growing number of members.

The Sons of Norway tour group of October 29 continued to the upper church building to view the beautiful structure and for further historical details. Due to the blessed vision of many of the early families the East Koshkonong Lutheran Church congregation has numerous pamphlets, stories, pictures, books, and charts detailing our history.





Bible Study – The Chosen


