Friends in Christ,

One of my favorite parts of serving as a pastor is listening to the questions people have. Questions are great. While I can't always fully answer every one of the questions I get, sorry I'm not smart or talented enough for that, I do enjoy processing questions with people. One of the most common questions that I've gotten during my call as Pastor has been people asking about what's happened to loved ones who have died. Losing a loved one is always tragic, and nothing which I'm about to write is meant to undermine or demean those losses and the ways we mourn. When our loved ones die, we constantly miss

them. However, we also want to know that they are going to be ok and that we'll see them again. Our faith teaches that Jesus was raised to life from the death that he suffered from his execution. Further scripture proclaims that the very body he died with was resurrected, reanimated, revived, or whatever word best suits you; still bearing the scars from his crucifixion (John 20:27). In other words, death wasn't the end because Jesus lived on after his death! The bible tells us that we too shall be raised from death in a similar manner. St. Paul writes in Romans that "if we have been united with [Jesus] in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his" (Romans 6:5). Further, we also confess this same promise every time we recite the Apostle's Creed and say we believe, "in the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting". This means that we all share in the promise of being raised from death to new life. I can't explain exactly how that will happen, like I said

earlier I'm not that smart or talented . But what I can say is that this is the promise which our faith teaches and which we will celebrate throughout this upcoming season of Easter.

The plans for providing ramping to access the Upper Church are moving forward. The next steps involve finalizing plans and having our construction company put the workforce in place and obtaining the proper permitting, etc.

The work is scheduled to begin in June and be completed in the mid-fall time frame. There will be some variables pertaining to timing with weather and product availability always being factors, but the hope is that we will not have too many obstacles and our accessibility will be achieved according to plan.

There have been questions regarding the way to donate to this project. An account has been established and we have taken the acronym of ABCD (easy to remember) which stands for Aagot Borge Church Development. So when writing a check or other means of donating, using the EKLC -ABCD will help with directing it to the appropriate fund.

I worked at Montgomery Ward while attending school. Dad had told me to never buy anything you cannot pay for, so, as I needed a winter coat, I had it put on 'layaway'. Finally, I had my black/white hounds-tooth check coat with a velvet collar! Wow! Three months after school, I got a job as a comptometer operator for Rayovac, I said I would never marry a

Life would never be the name for my Swiss farmer, but I did! I met Roger at a dance at Life would never a steer I was born in a rural Edwards Park. He was cute and a good immigrant parents after I was born in 8 rock County dancer. We had been a dancer in the county of th immigrant parents and a good farm home near Magnolia in Rock County, dancer. Working on the farm included helping with the milking, field work, raising pigs, big garden, butchering and canning meat, etc. Neighbors told me later that they could hear me yodeling while driving a tractor cutting hay, etc.! I really can't yodel!

Due to Roger's health concerns, we sold the cows in 1979 and took many trips. Branson, Nashville, Field of Dreams, Jackson Hole, California, Green Mountains, Switzerland, Mackinaw Island, Washington D.C. and more. I lived alone for eleven years after Roger died, then moved to a condo in Vennevoll and lived with Lena again, Woodcarving would become my new hobby. Playing euchre, puzzles, pot lucks, sewing, reading, daily outdoor walks, volunteering, Scherenschnitte, watching Jeopardy and Wheel of Fortune and other activities fill my days, Alone again, I am enjoying life in my Skaalen ridge apartment and nearby friends.

Memories of good parents, siblings, inlaws, my sons and their families, fellow travelers, dancing, dining friends will be with me forever. I thank God daily for all my blessings!

Items discussed:

Education Committee has emailed Sunday School families to ask for their input on utilization of Sunday School space.

East entrance – add to entrance way so public can access a Kiosk for Cemetery information.

Tree removal on west end of Sunday School Building

Replace or repair windows in front of lower church entrance.

2 lights outside of front door entrance do not turn on


