Friends in Christ,

I know this time of year is usually extremely joyous for most people, myself included. Yet I also know that for those who are experiencing loss and grief, that this time of year can be extremely difficult and trying. Truthfully, loss and grief affects everyone in some way. Either we ourselves are grieving loss(es), or we know someone else who is grieving. That is why I would like to share this letter to the editor my wife and I wrote together and submitted several years ago. I pray it's helpful for those who need it.

For the tired and grieving ones: If you are tired, that is ok. If you are angry, that is ok. If you have no idea how you're going to continue on, if you're exhausted, empty, or

full of anxiety, questions, or fear: we cannot fix it, but we can sit with you in it so you are not alone. When we live in true community, we suffer alongside one another. Loss is painful, whether it is the loss of a loved one, a community leader, health, a relationship, a job, or a dream. When you are the one who loses someone or something, after the initial outpouring of support, it might get a little quieter, a little lonelier. You continue on in your grief, in all the ways it affects you, but people might not know how to help, or how to support you, in the weeks and months to come.

You might feel some pressure to "get on with life", even though everything has changed and you might not know what your life is supposed to be about anymore. In those times, in the lonely and dark and hopeless times, we can still reach one another.

Facing what you really feel might help. Chances are that sharing your true feelings and experiences will help free others to do so as well. You weren't made to go through grief alone. There are people who can, and will, give support. Sometimes you will have to ask. Asking for help is not weakness. Sharing the truth in community is strength. It's ok to not be ok.

Thank you to all who reach out with kind words and gestures to those who grieve, or to those who are often forgotten. We don't always know how our actions, even small ones, will impact another human being.

In the midst of so much sadness, we have now, and we have each other. Our faith also tells us that we have God. May you grieve the way you need to, and may you not be alone in that grief. Neighbors, communities of faith, local clergy, counselors and doctors are all available to support you if that is what you need. Peace be with you.


