Friends in Christ,

On October 31, 1517, Dr. Martin Luther posted his 95 Thesis, which protested some of the unjust practices which the Roman Catholic Church was carrying out 500 years ago. Many theologians and historians consider this to be a pivotal event in the Reformation, which would eventually lead to the birth of our Lutheran denomination. That is why we observe Reformation Sunday at the end of each October. With that in mind, I feel it's important to clarify that Lutheranism is not a club where people who all look and sound the same get together. Rather, Lutheranism is about the gospel of God's grace freely given to the world in Jesus Christ. God's grace is freely given, we do not have to do anything to earn or deserve it, it is God's gift that we receive through our faith.

This gift frees us from sin and transforms us to worship God and participate in God's work by caring for our neighbors. Since God's grace is given to the whole world, there are Lutherans all across the globe, on every continent, except Antarctica. There are also numerous Lutheran charities that witness to the gospel by helping our neighbors around the world; i.e. Lutheran Services in America (LSA), Lutheran World Relief (LWF), ELCA World Hunger, and Global Refuge. Through your generous support, all of these organizations are helping to build the kind of world that God created us all to know and be a part of. Finally, it's important to understand that as ELCA Lutherans, we understand that the gospel does not reside exclusively with our expression of faith alone, and as a result we have full communion agreements with several other denominations. More recently, we have also repaired some of our relations with the Roman Catholic Church, which has actually repented from and changed many of the practices which Luther and the other reformers were protesting 500 years ago. I hope this provides some clarification as to what being Lutheran means as we observe Reformation Sunday this year.

NOTES/MINUTES FROM CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING ON AUGUST 19, 2025

Meeting called to order by President Kurt Klemp at 6:00 p.m.

Present: Anders Amundson, Kreg Gruben, Linda Hanson, Amy Hensel, Kurt Klemp, Peggy Luther, Denise Rockney, Pastor Eric Hanson, Financial Secretary Judy Lund, and guests Mark Veley and Bryar Veley.

Devotions: Be faithful. Our strength comes through Jesus.

Review & Approval of Financial Reports:

Judy reported that the significant expense of \$27,190 is for Ready Electric (through May) with lesser expenses still to come. Motion to approve financial reports made by Denise, seconded by Amy, and carried.

Report from Education Committee: Rally Sunday/Fun on the Prairie on Sept. 7; Bible distribution on Oct. 5; looking for volunteers to help with Sunday School; three Bingo events are scheduled this school year.

Report from Worship Committee: Summer Hymn Sings will continue next year; piano will be tuned in August; discussed frequency of worship services at Upper Church; October 19 is Reformation Sunday + Confirmation Sunday + Recognition of the Confirmation Class of 1975.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> One student, Casey T, will be confirmed on Oct. 19. With Judy R's help, the church directory has been updated and copies are available in the Narthex; Pastor is attending the Cambridge area clergy group and Southcentral Wis. Synod's clergy cluster gatherings; he will be on vacation Aug. 25-31.

July's Council Meeting Minutes: Accepted.

Motion to approve all committee reports + July's Council Minutes made by Denise, seconded by Amy, and carried.

OLD & NEW BUSINESS:

- Mark Veley said the Veley family will bring their food cart to Rally Sunday. (Yum yum!) Mark also spoke of the MASSIVE amount of water that rushed south from the cemetery, raising havoc, during the recent deluge. Rain water filled the window wells but thankfully didn't break window glass. The plan is to divert water as much as possible until there's a more permanent fix in the driveway on the north side of the education wing. (See Items 10 & 12.) Also, when time permits, the overgrown "mess" next to the road will be hacked down. There are no plans to address the landscaping at this time due to budget constraints. Discussed Lower Church signage.
- AED (*Automated External Defibrillator*) Device: Although this was on last month's agenda, the council again wishes to express deep appreciation to anonymous donors who covered *the entire \$2,200 cost* of a new AED. EKLC is very fortunate to have AEDs in both churches now.
- Sidewalks/concrete work: Although much has already been done, rain has caused delays. The Veleys are hoping to finish the work soon. (As an aside, council was told that Tom Hensel hauled out over 70 tons of old, busted-up cement sidewalk!)
- We eagerly await sanctuary lights & new ceiling fans from Ready Electric.
- Narthex Windows: After umpteen follow-ups from Denise, we are told that window repair/repainting is to commence tomorrow, Aug. 20.
- Office Manager: Still patiently looking for someone; we may have a good lead. A dedicated crew of office volunteers + Pastor Eric continue to pitch in with daily operations. (They'd probably like to "retire.")
- Insurance: Linda gave an overview of coverage that we now have through Brotherhood. It's good to be insured!
- Tax Parcels: Although not directly related to the tax parcels/Dane Co. Zoning discussion of last month, EKLC is now in receipt of a "Plat of Survey"--a legal document from Wisconsin Land Surveyor via David C. Riesop of Deerfield. This Plat of Survey encompasses *all church property*, including the cemetery and parsonage, and it is on file in the church office.
- LP Contract: Before signing a fuel contract, Kurt was assured that we will pay for only the fuel we use, as long as we remain a customer. Three new furnaces with programmable thermostats will likely result in fuel savings.

Eventually the current projects will end, but we are already looking ahead to future expenses. The **educational wing needs a new roof** and the **asphalt driveway** that continues to cause problems needs a Continued...

permanent fix. Lastly, there are no pressing **parsonage needs**, but several MAJOR expenses are on the horizon: the roof is 25 years old, the furnace is 23 years old, and the water heater is 13 years old. This congregation will need to decide if we want to continue parsonage upkeep or make the decision to sell the property and not be landlords.

Display unit needed for confirmation pictures. The current unit is filled up, and a new unit is needed. Bryar Veley stopped by at 7:15 p.m. to tell us how he proposes to route water away from the Lower Church. A

quick fix is only helpful in the short term, so correcting the asphalt driveway is becoming more imperative. He also told us he will pursue shingle repairs on the roof when there is enough work to warrant using a donated lift from the Hansons. Council asked Bryar to contact A1 tree service to cut down and remove several dead trees. If problems don't arise and the weather cooperates, Bryar hopes to complete concrete work by this Fri., the 22nd.

It's probably about time to test the well water. A \$15 test kit will likely be sufficient. Benevolence Giving: Council will soon re-visit the organizations that receive our donations.

A Celebration Of Norwegian Heritage On Koshkonong Prairie

Koshkonong Prairie Historical Society invites your organization to "A Celebration Of Norwegian Heritage On Koshkonong Prairie" to bring together organizations that foster the legacy of Norwegian immigrant history. The intent is to deepen our appreciation for Norwegian heritage across Koshkonong Prairie. The Celebration will highlight the vitality of each group, many of which are proudly celebrating milestone anniversaries or planning to do so in the near future.

Koshkonong Prairie Historical Society has taken the lead in sponsoring the event, with support from Norwegian American Genealogical Center in Madison as co-sponsor. St. Paul's Liberty Lutheran Church is hosting the event in its Education Center on Oak Park Road outside Deerfield.

A little history: Koshkonong Prairie is a Norwegian settlement historically known as the primary destination for Norwegian immigration from the 1840s to 1900, and ultimately the premier Norwegian settlement in America. Koshkonong was the wealthiest of all Norwegian settlements, with its vast bounty of uniquely rich soils, plentiful timber and stone for building, good water, and a strong work ethic producing the initial wealth of Dane County. Koshkonong Prairie also is a geophysical area, roughly circular in shape, about 12 miles across, in six townships in southeastern Dane County and portions of three townships in southwestern Jefferson County.


Koshkonong Prairie features the first ordained Norwegian Lutheran Church in America, with congregations established at East Koshkonong in October 1844 and ten days later at West Koshkonong. Extending the parish across the Prairie gave rise to several more Norwegian Lutheran congregations between 1851 and 1914 (in order): Liberty Prairie (now St. Paul's in Deerfield township), McFarland, Central (in Edgerton), Christ (in Stoughton), Deerfield, Rockdale, Cambridge (now Grace), and Central (in Stoughton). The Prairie also features Willerup Methodist, the oldest Scandinavian Methodist church in the world, founded in 1851 in Cambridge.

In addition to the churches, also invited are Sons Of Norway, Mandt Lodge and Idunn Lodge; Livsreise, Stoughton Norwegian Heritage Center; Norwegian Singers Association Of America, Edvard Grieg Chorus; Wisconsin State Rosemalers Associaion; Madison Torskeklubben; Gudrid Reading Circle, and others.

The event takes place at St. Paul's Liberty Lutheran Church, roughly centered on the Prairie, on Sunday, October 12, 2025. The doors will open to the public at noon and will wrap up by 2:30. Each group will have a table for brochures, items of interest, informational display, and representatives for question-answer chats. The first half hour will be an open house-style opportunity for mingling. At 12:30 there will be a presentation on Norwegian immigration to Wisconsin, followed by informal discussion among participants. Coffee, water, pastries, and Norwegian goodies will be on hand throughout.


