As we start packing away Christmas decorations and turning the calendar to 2026, we enter the beautiful season of Epiphany, which begins on January 6th (The Feast of the Epiphany), this season is the "crown" of the Christmas cycle. While Christmas celebrates the birth of Jesus, Epiphany celebrates His manifestation to the world. NOTES/MINUTES FROM CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING ON NOV. 18, 2025

Meeting called to order by President Kurt Klemp at 6:04 p.m.

Present: Kurt Klemp, Amy Hensel, Kreg Gruben, Denise Rockney, Pastor Eric Hanson, Anders Amundson, Linda Hanson, Peggy Luther, Financial Secretary Judy Lund, and guest Bryar Veley.

Devotion: Pastor Eric shared notes of thanks received from benevolence organizations. He said our gifts are truly making a difference.

REVIEW & APPROVAL OF FINANCIALS:

Discussion: Judy reported that nothing fiscally out of the ordinary happened in October. She prepared a draft budget for 2026; it needs several tweaks, especially info for the Pastor's Compensation Package, which comes from the Synod but is unknown at this time. Judy was asked to be present at the annual meeting to speak to the \$110,000 spent in repairs. Discussed missions and benevolences for 2026 and decided to continue giving ½ to local, ¼ to national, and ¼ to global organizations. Motion made by Linda, seconded by Amy, and carried to maintain the current \$12,000 amount, but discontinue (national) benevolence to Lutheran Indian Ministry, and (global) benevolence to NELC-India, and give to Arizona's Navajo Evangelical Luth. Mission (NELM) instead.

Worship Comm. Report: It was decided at this time to NOT pursue a new directory with Lifetouch. Next year will be a large Confirmation class. Three graduates will be invited to attend a service to recognize them in the spring. All is ready for Christmas services, including a "Blue" service on Wednesday, December 17, for those experiencing grief or sadness.

Pastor's Report: All Saints Sunday on November 2 went well. A few larger print bulletins are available on Sundays. Pastor attended a synod Collaborative Boundaries Education Day in Watertown on November 6.

Education Comm. Report: Ornaments are for sale in the narthex with profits going to a camp scholarship fund. Sunday School Christmas Program is on the 14th. Ideas for a middle/high school youth group are being explored.

Motion made by Amy to approve **financial reports + October's Minutes + all committee reports**, seconded by Denise, and carried.

OLD & NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. <u>Current projects:</u> Bryar plans to put exterior handrails up shortly and install a new door lock to the furnace room in the Upper Church. The sign in front of the church is getting a sprucing up. Heating and cooling issues are being addressed. Stumps to be removed next year. Need a new person (Eric Schroeder?) to plow in the winter. Veleys will do the shoveling as needed.
- 2. Confirmation photo display stand: tabled for now.
- 3. <u>Parsonage</u>: A recent property revaluation has more than doubled the assessed value, and it remains to be seen how this will affect property tax. There are no pressing parsonage needs at this time. Council is interested in seeing a breakdown of expenses for the parsonage as well as each of the two church buildings so we have a good idea of what it costs to maintain each of the properties. It seems likely that insurance premiums for all three properties will increase.
- 4. <u>Livestreaming:</u> Still looking to improve the ease of use, and it would be ideal to be able to remotely operate the livestream.
- 5. <u>Office Manager:</u> It's difficult to find a good candidate for this part-time position! Council would like to let our office volunteers retire!!
- 6. <u>Church Custodian:</u> We have a description of what needs to be routinely cleaned (likely a 5-hour/week position). There may be a person interested.
- 7. Expense Reimbursement Policy: Draft #1 was distributed, with changes forthcoming.

- 8. <u>Changing of the Guard:</u> Two council members (Linda and Peggy) are finishing their terms and need to be replaced. We also need two delegates to attend the annual Synod Assembly in early May.
- 9. <u>Checklist for Maintenance:</u> Kurt received an info packet from Lane and Marilyn that lists everything needing attention on a routine basis (e.g., pumps/filters/furnace/bulbs, etc.) in one concise document.
- 10. <u>Trust Fund Investment Policy:</u> Trust Fund Committee members, Tom S., Oren H., and Marilyn G., provided a one-page investment policy document that expresses the financial goals of EKLC that will be provided to our advisors at Thrivent and Edward Jones. Motion made by Kreg, seconded by Denise, and carried to approve the policy document.

Next Meeting: Tuesday, December 9 @ 6 p.m.

Motion to Adjourn at 8:23 made by Denise, seconded by Linda. We closed with The Lord's Prayer.

Final (maybe) ramp update

Just over a year ago, on November 17, we celebrated the completion of our ramp project. as it turned out, it was even more of a blessing than we imagined. As the project has made our upper building ADA compliant and accessible for all, we had met the goal of keeping this beautiful historic church available for worship going forward.

A situation came up we hadn't anticipated. Our insurance carrier saw fit to drop all churches older than one hundred years. This affected many churches in our area and far beyond. In seeking a new insurer, we were faced with making many upgrades to the lower church building and because of our recent project at the upper building, only a few upgrades there. It is very likely that without the work of the project, our upper building may have been considered not able to be used. So, an unexpected blessing.

We have paid off our bank loan and the entire debt has been cleared. Due to the incredible generosity of all of you, this project is now complete. Our Aagot Borge Committee plans to work with the worship committee to schedule summer worship services and is in the process of planning some special events as well. We have been greatly blessed and are so very grateful.. thanks be to God!


