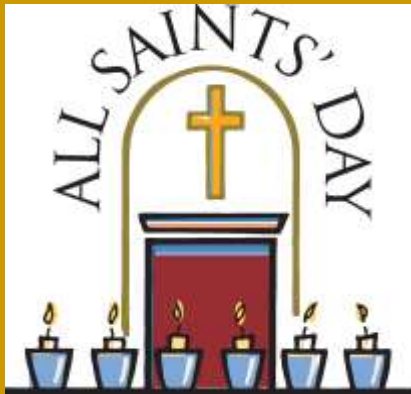

Motion to approve August 19, 2015, meeting minutes was made by Hilary Terland, seconded by Don Amundson. Motion carried.

Financial Report:

Custodial invoices for supplies to finishing floors were moved from custodial expense to building repair expense per Council request at August meeting.

\$13,232 still due on building loan

Council requested to move the \$23.00 from the Altar table fund to the Altar Guild fund to close that fund.

Motion to approve the August financial reports was made by Don Amundson, seconded by Brenda Schroeder. Motion carried.

Don Amundson received the information from Church Mutual regarding the church property insurance review and premiums. Don will be contacting them to clarify some information and ask about some possible options that may be available with having two church buildings.

Old Business:

Floor waxing bids to clean and wax all rooms and hallways that have tiles

Sonja has received two bids

ZBM out of Watertown, bid was \$1,900

Galaxy out of Janesville, bid was \$1,320. Concern over what their service may be like as they were not real responsive with the bid request.

Discussed putting this item in the budget for 2017 as there is a concern that tiles may lift as a result of the cleaning/finishing process. Also discussed the possibility of doing a special drive to fund the project – no decision was made

New Business:

Annual meeting was scheduled for Sunday, January 24, 2016. The alternative date if we have inclement weather is Sunday, January 31, 2016.

Internet speed at the church is very slow. Found we were under a residential plan instead of a business plan. If we change to a business plan this will increase the expense by \$15.00 per month. We are not tied into any contracts with the internet provider. The change will not drastically increase our service level but it will help. It was decided to upgrade to a business plan.

Ali Geseng is an older colorful Yamap man who caused Yamap translator Isaac a lot of concern during the recent Alphabet Design Workshop. When the helicopter brought Ray Stegeman and Mission Ayabe to Baitainglout to run the workshop, they were met by Yamap community leaders and a decorated group of singers and dancers. Those welcoming the two guests were mortified when Ali led the two of them away from the welcoming party and took them to the cemetery. When they got to the cemetery, Ray and Mission expected that Ali wanted to talk about something private, but instead he just turned around and went back to the larger group. The group welcomed the guests with a ceremony and then led them to their lodging. A short while later, Ali showed up again, this time at the guest's lodging and told them that they had to give him their mobile phones and cameras. And during the workshop, Ali strongly opposed Isaac on how a certain sound should be spelled and showed no openness to come to an agreement.

Ali came to our next workshop in Lae. Isaac was afraid he'd cause problems like at the Alphabet workshop, but was surprised and pleased when he worked cooperatively with the translation team. At the end of the workshop, Isaac left a few days early to attend a Yamap community meeting that would discuss some of the translation and alphabet issues that had been raised at the Alphabet workshop. Before Isaac left Lae, Ali told him, "If anyone complains about the work you translators are doing, tell them, 'Ali before was against the translation and alphabet. But now he has joined the translation work. So I encourage everyone to leave their complaining and help the translators with the work they are doing.'"

Praise God that He is at work in the lives of the Yamap people as they for the first time in their lives, hear His Word in their own language! Thank you for your part in bringing God's Word to the people of Papua New Guinea in the languages that speak to their hearts!

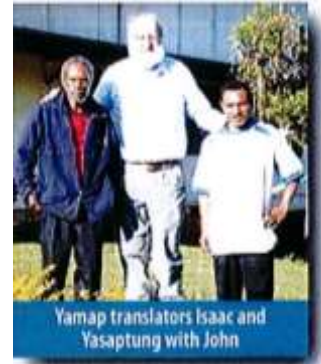

Prayer and Praise

- 1) **PRAISE** God for increasing interest among the Kapin people. Pray that the booklets of Scripture readings for each Sunday would be used and that people would grow in their hunger for hearing the Scriptures in their own language. Praise God for the high level of commitment shown for their work by translators Itama, Yandabing and Pastor Roy.
- 2) **PRAISE** God that 184 Yamap people signed up to receive booklets of Scripture readings to be used in their church services. Pray that the preschool teachers would be highly motivated to teach the children at their schools to read. Pray for Isaac as he encourages and teaches Yamap people as he helps them learn to read the Scriptures.
- 3) **PRAY** that our translation workshop which will go from October 19-30 in Lae with five language groups will run smoothly. Pray for safety as the teams travel and that God would help us know how best to translate His Word and get it into the hands of the people.
- 4) **PRAY** that the Kala translators would take initiative to get feedback from their community on what they have translated. Also that the translators would complete their translation assignment between workshops. Pray that the community would continue to gain a taste for hearing God's Word in their heart language and would develop a hunger for more. Pray for the translators: Jon Yawe, Ngasigom Alinga, Awateng Malatu, and Lucy Yawe.
- 5) **At our most recent workshop**, the Malei team made 6 two hour presentations on Scripture Confronts Culture. The goal was to compare cultural practices to what Scriptures says. Pray that the translators would take what they learned during those sessions and share them with their own people.
- 6) **Our son Samuel** is a senior here at Ukarumpa International School and is currently applying to colleges. He is hitting some roadblocks. Please pray with us that God would work all this out according to His will.

Thankful Hearts


Make table decorations that serve as Thanksgiving conversation-starters.

What you need:

- Paper and pencil
- Scissors
- Cloth or felt
- Needle and thread
- Sewing machine (optional)
- Fiber fill, cotton balls or rice
- Adult help

What you do:

1. Cut out a heart pattern (any size) on paper. Allow 1/4" for a seam if you'll be using a sewing machine.
2. Cut out material hearts, placing pieces right sides out if sewing by hand and right sides together if using a machine.
3. For hand-sewing, use a running stitch or an overcast stitch. Leave an opening for stuffing.
4. With a machine, sew along a 1/4" seam, allowing a 1" opening so you can turn the heart inside out and insert stuffing. Trim close to seam but don't cut stitching.
5. Fill with stuffing. Sew the opening shut by hand.
6. Put a heart at each place setting. Before dinner, have guests pick theirs up and say why they have a thankful heart.
