Dear Friends of East Koshkonong,

I always think about the 4th of July as the mid-point of summer. Before we know it, back-to-school sales will be everywhere and school will be starting again. Can you believe the summer is half over? Time is a gift, yet we never seem to have enough.

*I want you all to know that you can always come to me with concerns about what we are doing at church or about what I am doing as pastor.* I have an open door policy, **and you'll find that I literally have my office door open many times throughout the week.** Anyone can come talk to me about any concern or joy or suggestion. I strive to be approachable and even-tempered.

It has come to my attention that some people wonder how I spend my time and that it looks on the newsletter calendar like **I'm only working on Sunday and Tuesday.** This is not at all the case! I work Sunday, and Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday every week. If I schedule something on Monday or Friday, (although I try to avoid it) I will be there. If there is an emergency on one of those days, I will be there. **On days when I'm not in the office at church, I may be visiting people or having a meeting with colleagues or finding a place to write without distractions.** In the office, I might be meeting with someone, responding to phone calls and emails, organizing classes or worship services, writing for the newsletter or my sermons, planning for committee meetings. The sermon is always in process; there are always visits to make, people to catch up with, events or meetings to get ready for. **This doesn't include time to study and stay connected to the church outside of East Koshkonong.**

**I will make it clearer on our monthly newsletter calendar which days I am "on duty" and which days I am technically "off."** However, there is not a day that goes by where our ministry at EKLC is not on my mind. I am **always thinking and praying about what we do together in Christ's name.**

**Here's how I spent a ministry week in June.** I confess that this was more than a three-quarter time week, which is defined as 35-38 hours. I worked 42 hours between June 15 and June 21.

- Monday, June 15: 5-8pm - pre-wedding counseling session with prep time (3 hours)
- Tuesday, June 16: 8:30-9:45am - staff meeting; 9:45-10am - POP service; 10-10:45am - community tour with council president; 10:45am-1pm - office hours; 1-5pm catch up with emails, writing sermon, bulletin prep, getting ready for council meeting, study time for sermon and other events. (8.5 hours)
- Wednesday, June 17: 10-11am - hospital visit; 11am-5:30pm - long-term worship prep, youth group prep, confirmation prep, final council prep; 6:15-9pm council meeting; 9-10:30am; study and prayer after meeting (11.75 hours)
- Thursday, June 18: 8:15-10:45am - finish work for worship prep; 10:45am-12:30pm - text study with colleagues; 12:30-2:30pm - meeting with colleague; 2:30-5:30pm - catch up with emails, look at sermon, and write notes to birthdays, baptismal anniversaries, and wedding anniversaries (8.25 hours)
- Friday, June 19: 4-6pm called in for an emergency homebound visit (2 hours)
- Saturday, June 20: 8-9pm final look-through of sermon (1 hour)
- Sunday, June 21: 7:30-9am get church and self ready for worship; 9-10:15am worship service; 10-11:30am catch up with and learn about people, work on learning names; 2-4pm write letter to go in mail, look at text for next Sunday, clean up emails; 4-5:30 hospital visit (7.5 hours)

I close with some wisdom from Proverbs. Proverbs 16:9 - **"The human mind plans the way, but the Lord directs the steps."** Thanks be to God!
