President's Report

Dear Congregation:

2020 – What a year of changes it has been! I don't think anyone could have predicted when the clock turned over last January to 2020, what kind of year all of mankind was in for. Our services, in the traditional sense, halted in March with the arrival of COVID. I am very proud of the quick response our church, along with Pastor Brenda, had with offering online services to members, and the general public. Fall came and area COVID numbers began to go on the rise, thus taking us back to online only worship. We began planning for what Advent Christmas season would look like for us. Also in late fall, we learned of Pastor Brenda's resignation as our Pastor here at EKLC. We are grateful for her 5 1/2 years here, leading out congregation in worship. Now, the next call committee will be tasked with bringing our next Pastor here to EKLC. Please pray for that committee and for God to watch over and guide that process.

To say that my last year serving as your Council President was challenging is an understatement. Your council members have worked hard each month navigating how to keep us all engaged and connected, while we are apart. The health and well-being of our membership has always been at the core of any decisions that were made this past year. We are thankful to all members that kept giving to EKLC this past year, your gifts are certainly appreciated as we tried to stay pace with expenses.

As I leave as Council President – my hope for our beloved church is for continued growth. So many people, past and present, have done positive things to lay the foundation to continue to build on here at EKLC. However, this growth will not happen without open minds, hearts, and volunteerism. There are many opportunities to be involved in a variety of ways – and I hope in new ways.

Dear Friends at EKLC,

Acts 2:42-43 says this about the early church: *The believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, to the community, to their shared meals, and to their prayers. A sense of awe came over everyone. God performed many wonders and signs through the apostles.*

While 2020 became a difficult year for us, we absolutely rose to the challenge. We have never closed the church. Closing the church would mean that we didn't worship or serve the community or learn together or stay connected. Being a church in a pandemic means that we needed to get creative in how to still be open without gathering in person and without using the building. There were lots of trials, lots of errors, and countless successes. This was not my work. It was *our* work.

From March 15 through July, we had virtual worship services. Through August and September, we had in person and virtual worship services. From October through the end of the year, we had virtual worship services. It's really hard to count how many people connected through virtual worship, so we don't have good attendance records. This is something the entire church all over the planet will have to adapt to, possibly forever. I anticipate that virtual worship services are here to stay, even after the pandemic is over.

Our education programs kept on. Our service projects continued. We tried to stay connected to people through the means of emails and phone calls and mailings. We had a very successful year in figuring out how to do ministry differently and reaching people who we wouldn't normally reach.

I have to be honest - and I'm sure you all know this to be true too - planning anything in 2020 took at least three times the amount of work that planning it before the pandemic hit. The good thing about this is that we had to pay extra attention to our time and what was important and what we needed to let go of.

I challenge you in 2021 to do the same thing. What is the most important priority in your life? Are you paying attention to it? Or filling life with other things that make those priorities slide?

You have some exciting times up ahead. Forming a call committee. Assessing what the church needs in this time and place in a pastor. Interviewing and calling a pastor. I think it's exciting and hopeful. I will continue to pray for you as I begin my next phase in ministry.

I want to thank all of the people who have supported our ministry together. Thank you for working with me through my tenure at EKLC and through this particularly difficult year. Thank you to those who have tolerated the changes we had to make in keeping ministry going through this year. Thank you to the staff, the council, the committees, and all of the volunteers. East Koshkonong would not run without your work.

In the future, I encourage you to remember why we are here, what the faith is about, what the early church did to share the message of Jesus (see the Bible quote above), and most of all, share the light and love of Jesus.

Worship Committee Report

This committee consists of all Worship Assistants, all accompanists and a representative from the Altar Guild. We meet the first Wednesday of each month at 7:30. We met in person until October where we switched to Zoom phone meetings.

The Worship Committee plans service formats and music for the church year. The Narrative Lectionary has been used and we are completing our fourth year of it. We also schedule the use of the Upper Church for Sundays, Easter Sunrise Service, Midweek Advent Services and midweek Lenten services in the Lower Church. We are coffee hour hosts for Confirmation Sunday and Graduation Recognition Sunday. Members of this committee schedule Communion Set-up, Ushers, Greeters, Money Counters, Worship Assistants, Lectors, Communion Assistants, special music for the Summer and building Lock-up while the Altar Guild changes the banners and paraments, brings out the candelabra when needed, the Advent wreath, etc, all according to the church year.

Given the Pandemic hitting us in March, this committee did not plan anything past March 8th when the Senior Choir sang. A couple members chose hymns to enhance the readings for the summer Roman series. We had some outdoor services, two months in person (August and September) and then virtual. Confirmation was held outside so that did not allow this committee to celebrate with our usual cake for the Confirmands or the 50th Anniversary Confirmation Classmates. Nor could we celebrate in a typical fashion with a reception for our graduates.

We were concerned about reaching people and sent out a survey to find out how and if members were connecting with EKLC during these times. We also received statistics from Pastor Brenda as to how many had partaken in the drive through Communion as well as the outside services and the in person ones.

In addition to services online, Pastor Brenda had Tuesday morning Prayers For Our People on Facebook, Advent Midweek services were pre recorded and broadcast each Wednesday evening at 7, Stewardship talks were on Facebook as well as daily readings by our members for each day of Advent. The Children's Christmas Program was shown online December 20th and Christmas Eve was pre recorded and shown on Christmas Eve at 3. There was also a drive through Christmas Eve Event of Lessons and Carols that took one around the cemetery with stops to read from Luke 2 and sing a verse of a Christmas Carol.

Education Committee

The Education Committee is devoted to our Sunday School children as they learn Bible stories and grow in their faith; following our young people as they confirm their faith; and encouraging all members to continue to learn and grow in their faith and lives.

The Committee oversees the EKL Youth Group, selects curriculum for the Sunday school and Confirmation, as well as adult forums and Bible study opportunities for the adults of the congregation. Committee members consist of the Pastor, a Council liaison, the Youth Director, the Sunday School Superintendent, the Sunday School Music Coordinator, a Confirmation (parent) representative, and any additional member/s of the congregation interested in developing education opportunities for the members of EKLC.

Throughout the year, the committee worked on various tasks related to adult study, confirmation, a revitalized youth group, and Sunday school. Highlights from the year:

Adult Study

The Education Committee encourages the adults to study throughout the year. We had several book studies through the virtual format - one by Facebook, which was a hard format to use, and four by Zoom. These studies are very lightly attended - it would be great for our adults to study, learn, and grow together! The books were *Everything Happens for a Reason and other Lies I've Loved* by Kate Bowler (although we didn't finish this one), *Outlaw Christian* by Jacqueline Bussie, *Grateful* by Diana Butler-Bass (by video), *Sabbath* by Wayne Muller, and *Mirror for the Soul* by Alice Fryling.

Youth Group

The EKLC Youth Group met a few times this year early in the morning to check in. We also had a couple of Zoom meetings. We canceled the summer mission trip to Denver.

Confirmation

- Four ninth graders were confirmed in October of 2020, and our current class has 2 eighth graders who are on track to being confirmed in 2021, and 3 seventh graders, who would be confirmed in 2022.
- Pastor Brenda and Debbie Wethal (youth director) are using the *Faith 5* curriculum, which switches focus each year between "Lutheran Living" & "Lutheran History & Catechism" (2020-2021) and the Old and New Testament (on track for 2021-2022).
- The students packed care packages for the EKLC members who are currently in college and those stationed in the military. This happens twice annually, in the spring and fall.

Sunday School

- The Bloom in Faith Curriculum is being used this year for PreK-6th grade. This is a new curriculum that the teachers & kids have loved so far! All of our fall 2020 classes were held virtually, after a brief time in person in the month of September Under normal years, the classes would be split into 3 or 4 groups, based on age. 6th grade has taken a "pre-confirmation" path in the recent past that we would definitely want to continue this in the future!
- The Sunday School year starts with Rally Day in September, and finishes with Youth Sunday in May. The Christmas Program and monthly service projects are the highlights in between.

The Education Committee would especially like to thank Debbie Wethal for spearheading and supervising the Youth Group activities, as well as her leadership over the Sunday School Program. Another special thank you to all the dedicated teachers: Lindsay Baker, Erica Lien, Emma Nottestad, Denise Rockney, Shawn Schlieckau, Mallory Wallace, Thianna Wegner, and Alyssa Woodley. Finally, those involved with the youth programs especially would like to thank the entire congregation for their incredible support & look forward to more fun activities in 2021.

- 4. Deal with people directly; don't complain to others. "If one of my followers sins against you, go and point out what was wrong. But do it in private, just between the two of you." Matthew 18:15. If someone complains to you about another member, help that person follow this principle.
